Ready for PDPM on OBRA Assessments?

CMS announced as of 10/1/2020, all stand-alone OBRA assessments will have the capability to generate a PDPM HIPPS code. ECS is preparing the necessary programming to accommodate this change. Facilities will have the option to turn this feature on in Site Settings, dependent on their state's preference.

What does this mean for your state?

The first step is to check with your state to determine if this feature needs to be turned on as of October 1. If so, your

facility will need to prepare to complete the same charting that is completed for Medicare residents, on all residents. On a stand-alone OBRA, the following items will be active that have previously been inactive: I0020, I0020B, GG0130 (Self-Care Admission questions), GG0170 (Mobility Admission questions), and J2100 (which could trigger J2300-J5000 if J2100 is answered with a "yes").

Question I0020B will require an approved diagnosis code, even on a stand-alone OBRA. CMS has stated for this MDS type, facilities may utilize a code from the current ICD codes table, or they may utilize a code from a secondary table, which has yet to be released by CMS. In addition, facilities will need to document Section GG charting. If your facility does not already have the most updated charting screens for GG, please contact clinical@american-data.com to get those transferred into your system. Lastly, question J2100 regarding prior surgeries will need to be answered.

What are the next steps?

Keep an eye out for upcoming webinars to be held in August/September, which will provide more details on these upcoming changes and guide you on preparation steps.


