Purpose/Source

American Data developed Patient Centered Care Planning module in response to the Final Rule of 2016 where 483.21 details the need for comprehensive patient centered care planning as followings (Source Leading Age):

§483.21 Comprehensive person-centered care planning.

- Requires development of a baseline care plan for each resident within 48 hours of admission, including instructions needed to provide effective and person-centered care meeting professional standards; identifies the minimum healthcare information necessary, e.g., initial goals based on admission orders; physician orders; dietary orders; therapy services; social services. A copy must be provided to the resident/representative.
- Facilities may develop a comprehensive care plan in place of the baseline if the
 comprehensive care plan is developed within 48 hours of the resident's admission
 and meets all comprehensive care plan requirements, e.g., services to be
 provided; residents' goals, residents' preference and potential for future
 discharge.
- Requires the care plan to include any specialized services or specialized rehabilitation services the facility will provide as a result of PASRR; a rationale for disagreement with PASRR findings must be documented in the medical record.
- Adds a nurse aide, food and nutrition services, and a social worker to the interdisciplinary team (IDT) that develops the comprehensive care plan.

Discharge Planning [as part of Comprehensive Person-Centered Care Planning]:

Requires facilities to document and update residents' goals for discharge; assess
potential for future discharge; involve and inform the resident/representative;
document the resident has been asked about their interest in receiving
information regarding return to community.



The care plans are based on the following tenets:

- Focus on "NEED" / "INTEREST" instead of "PROBLEM"
- First Person instead of 3rd person
- Resident's desire vs. Medical Needs/Diagnoses
- How to continue resident's routines instead of how to fit resident into facility's routine
- Written in lay persons terms
- Compatible with MDS 3.0 Approach
